TUITION OFFICE ~ DO YOU KNOW?

- FACTS will attempt three times to collect your tuition payment but only <u>once</u> for Incidental billing. If an incidental bill is missed, you must force pay that bill through FACTS directly or send payment to the tuition office and they can receive it as "paid at the institution".
- FACTS puts your tuition payment into its payment queue 2 business days before it's due. Any adjustments must be made before that time. The tuition office is unable to make any adjustments to that bill after that.

Re-enrollment will begin on **Monday**, **January 8**, **2024**. Please check your



email for this important information. As a reminder, the financial aid application for FACTS is online. Information was sent home in October. The deadline to complete the application is **Thursday**, **February 1st**. You can also go to our website at
