1. We would like the students to do a “chore” around the house, maybe rake some leaves, clean a room, help a younger brother or sister, etc. to earn money to purchase a ready-made pie from Wegmans, Tops, BJ’s, wherever you grocery shop. The pies may be a pumpkin, cherry, apple, pecan, your choice. The pies **cannot be frozen**, they must be ready-to-eat store-bought pies.

3. On Monday, November 23rd, please have your child/children bring in their **store-bought pie** to school in the morning. **This is the only day the pies should come into school.** The pies will be delivered to the Rescue Mission in the afternoon on Monday, November 23rd.

Please remember this is a service project. Our hope is that the students learn that one small chore can earn some money to help those in need. If each family brings in 1 pie, we will be able to provide close to 150 pies to the Rescue Mission!
